



Having been appointed following a limited competition, BH&M were challenged by the construction of three new facilities: a social centre for the sixth form, an Arts centre and a swimming pool. Originally the College had envisaged a total complex incorporating all three requirements but after a strategic planning exercise it became clear that there were ideal sites for all three to be separately located. The first of the three buildings was the social centre, now known as the Marlburian, which operates as a sixth form centre and includes a small cafeteria, bar and discotheque for parties.

The large recreation space is also extensively used for all kinds of other activities both within and without the College ranging from teaching to aerobics.

Located just north of the College's main facilities, it has its own separate parking arrangements and can be used for those livelier functions which accompany school life without upsetting the neighbours.
